Are You REALLY Registered to Vote?

If you haven't voted since the November 2012 General Election, your name may have been removed from Ohio's Voter Registration list. In order to be certain that you will be able to vote this Fall, go online http://www.voterfind.com and check "Voter Registration Information / Am I Registered?" or call the Adams County Board of Elections, 544-2633, and ask them to check for you.

If you have moved and/or changed your name since the last time you voted, you may be challenged when you go to vote. This is an easy problem to resolve. Simply complete an "updated," half-page registration form with the correct information and return it (in person or by mail) prior to the registration deadline.

Registration forms are available from the Adams County Board of Elections, the BMV (Bureau of Motor Vehicles), online at http://www.electionsonthe.net/oh/adams, and in several other locations. They are all straight-forward and easy to complete. Just remember to use a blue or black pen, if you are filling out the half-page form by hand.
